Was living at 38 Devonshire Road, Croydon while playing for the amateur Croydon Common club
The 1901 Census records him at that address as a 19 year old lath render, living with his father (40), also named Francis and a lath render, his mother Alice (37) and sisters Frances (12), Catharine (10) and Alice (3) and brothers Edwin (6) and Albert (10 months)
The 1911 Census records him as living (no occupation given) at 30 Cromwell Road, Croydon with his wife Harriett (28), and sons Francis (4), Charles (2) and one as yet unnamed (born 1910)
Married Harriet Rebecca Rose (1882-1966) in Croydon on Christmas Day 1905 and they had eight children
Only played for the amateur Croydon Common club, with whom he won medals and local league representative honours
Played in the amateur club's first ever game and ended the first season as second highest scorer with 11 goals
He was spotted while playing for the Common by former Saints player Billy Ponting, who recommended him to Southampton
His appearances for Southampton were as a full back
