<i>Jottings</i>
Was christened on 26 July 1891 at Hinxhill in Kent
Scored on his debut for Herne Bay in a 1-1 draw with Folkestone in the East Kent League and later against his future club Margate
By the time he arrived at Ramsgate, he had apparently also played for Whitstable and Canterbury
He appeared in 3 games for Margate, scoring twice, while playing predominantly for Ashford Railway Works in the 1912-13 season
He scored a hat trick for Derby County in a 7-0 home win over Barnsley on the opening day of the 1914-15 season and the Rams ended the season as Division Two champions after finishing bottom of Division One the season before
Guested for Crystal Palace in the London Combination in 1915-16 and scored in a match against Croydon Common
Was Ashford Railway Works top scorer in 1921-22 with 8 goals, despite not playing much and often in the defence
Once appeared in goal for Ashford Railway Works Reserves, but punched and sliced two goals into his own net!
The 1911 Census records him as a veterinary assistant living at 24 East Hill in Ashford, Kent
Was the brother in law of Kent and England cricketer Frank Woolley; his sister married the cricketer on 16.9.1914 in Willesborough, Kent
